Why Study This Course?

- You have a genuine interest in the world around you, how it works and how places and events are inter-linked.
- You are interested in the science behind landscapes and natural systems; how they are formed and how they are dynamic and constantly changing.
- You would like to know more about the way humans interact to change our natural environment, our urban areas and our global economy.



Career Progression

- Geography is a valuable A-Level qualification which is in high demand due to the wide range of skills it helps to develop. The Guardian and Michael Palin have both named it as the "Must-have A-Level."
- Our A-level Geographers have gone into extremely varied fields such as: architecture, journalism, banking, law, dentistry, engineering, marketing and scientific research. Careers more specific to the course include: pollution consultancy, surveying and transport planning.
- Some of our alumni have gone on to study Geography at degree level at Oxbridge.

What You'll Study

Year 1:

- Hazards - Plate tectonics, volcanoes, earthquakes, storms and forest fires.
- Coastal Systems and Landscapes - Study of the coast as a dynamic system affected by wind, waves, currents and the imprint of mankind.
- Changing Places - Learning about perceptions of place via two case studies – one local suburb and one faraway city.
- Fieldtrip – Four days in Wales to study both human and physical landscapes.

Year 2:

- Global Systems and Global Governance - an in-depth analysis of the complexity of contemporary world affairs.
- Water and Carbon Cycles - Considering the physical processes of both cycles and the reasons for change over time (EG. climate change).
- Contemporary Urban Environments - exploring urban growth and change which currently present significant environmental and social challenges.
- Fieldwork Investigation - Write up of one geographical enquiry. Students will work independently on individual questions.

Why Parrs Wood?

Fieldwork is an integral part of a geography A-level. Students are required to complete at least four full days of fieldwork and this will take place at the Rhyd-y-creuau field studies centre in Conwy, Wales. We visit the Criccieth beach to collect data on the coastal processes at work. We also consider the changing character of Betws-y-Coed and Llandudno, tourist honey-pot sites.
